How can I get involved?

Initial engagement with communities who are not well served by the early learning and schooling system will take place in August-September 2018. There will be formal consultation on a draft NELP in February-March 2019.

A series of regional fono have been held with Pacific families and communities and specific Pacific focus groups e.g. disability groups and youth. Further consultation with Pacific communities and focus groups on changes to the plan will take place in October.

A round of wānanga is in planning for August-September 2018; A second round of wānanga will focus specifically on the Ka Hikitia strategic framework in November 2018.

Engagement with exponents of mātauranga Māori happened at a Hui in Wellington on 23 July. This took the form of a Think Tank to identify and recommend the critical success factors for both initiatives.

There will be public engagement on options in August-September 2018

This work is building on significant engagement over the last couple of years. A Building on Success for All forum including 80-90 key stakeholders occurred on 18 June. Further targeted engagement on a draft Action Plan will take place mid-August through mid-September.
