

Education Work Programme

Advisory and Reference Groups

All parts of the Education Work Programme will involve close engagement and collaborative design with New Zealanders., including children, young people and other learners, parents, Iwi, communities, employers and people working in the education sector.

As well as this broad engagement, some specific advisory groups and reference groups have been convened to provide advice and bring ideas and expertise.

All parts of the work programme have a Māori Medium and Māori education perspective. This is reflected, either in the membership of each advisory group, or through specific Māori medium groups.

These groups are made up of people from the education sector and the wider community. They are supported by the Ministry of Education.

These groups range from the Tomorrow's Schools Independent Taskforce to advisory groups appointed by the Minister of Education to advise him, to reference groups who are providing their insights to the Ministry of Education.

The Minister of Education has also appointed a Youth Advisory Group of young people which has provided advice on a broad range of education topics (this group is not tied directly to the education Work Programme).
